Mission Statement

The mission of the Certified Nurse Technician program is to provide the opportunity to build the knowledge, skills, and attitudes that are essential for successful entry-level employment in the allied health field through technical instruction and training.

Program Insights

This program prepares students to enter health-care facilities, such as hospitals, private duty services, physicians offices, and schools in our five-county service area and the surrounding area.

The course content includes basic nursing skills, patient personal care and hygiene, communication and interpersonal interaction, ethical and legal responsibilities in the work setting, infection

control methods, safety measures, rehabilitation and restorative care, and patient mental health needs. Upon successful completion of the course and attendance of 102 clock hours, the student is eligible to sit for the State of Tennessee's Nurse Aide Test to become a Certified Nurse Technician (CNT).
